ROTOPOL

Rotopol is a publishing house for graphic storytelling located in Kassel, Germany. Our catalogue includes comics and picture books for children and adults as well as art prints, paper games, postcards, and sketchbooks. With its publications, Rotopol explores the boundaries of what illustration and comics can accomplish and offers readers the chance to discover high quality books and exciting talents with individual drawing and storytelling styles.

For our selection of publications, we focus on works that have been developed by the artists themselves and which combine a powerful graphic technique with innovative narrative styles and personal stories. Rotopol wants to offer a home to these books and their unmistakable voices. The originality and creativity inherent in these projects are what excite us about publishing.

At the same time, we understand Rotopol as a network for the creative exchange between contemporary German-speaking artists, international artists, and an interested public. To promote this dialogue, we travel around the world, visit book fairs, comics and literature festivals, and organize exhibitions and events such as readings and workshops. In order to reach a wider audience, we often publish titles in English in addition to the German edition. We envision Rotopol as a platform to manifest the creative potential around us, to further develop it and make it visible in various ways.

Since the founding of Rotopol in 2007, our publishing office in Kassel is located in the same space as our book store which invites to browse through a diverse selection of picture books, comics, graphic novels and zines. After being awarded the "Publishing Prize of the State of Hesse" in 2018 and the "German Publishing Prize" in 2020 and 2022, Rotopol was one of three publishers to be awarded the "Top Prize of the German Publishing Prize" in 2023.

To save her best friend, Trixi needs to get over her insecurities and believe in herself. Maybe staying true to who she is won't be so bad after all, who knows?

This colourful comic doesn't just tell an exciting story, but it also encourages children to take pride on what makes them unique and to support each other. On the way, it seizes the occasion to highlight how insects aren't "disgusting" at all but beautifully diverse and deserving of a place in our world.

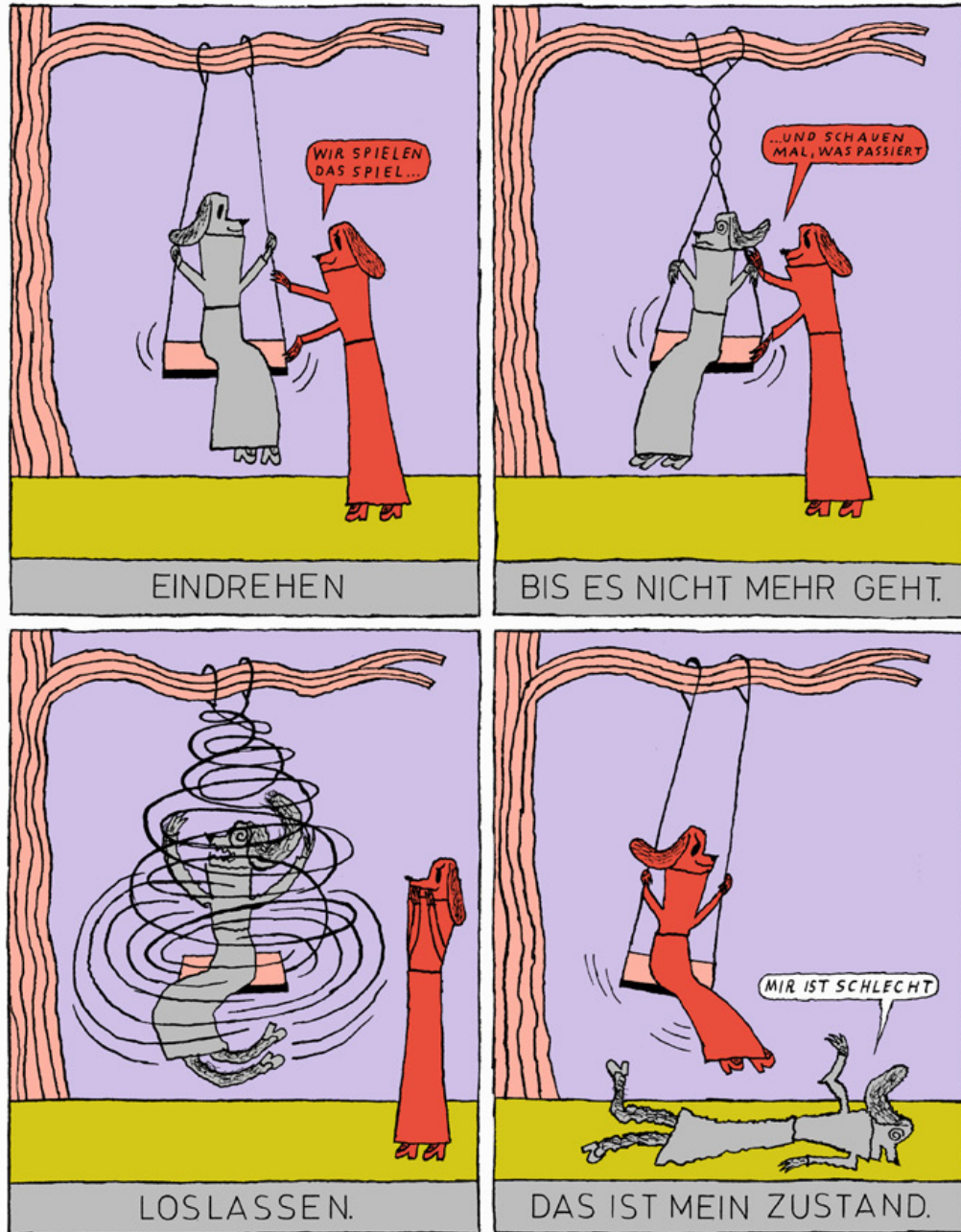
In her intimate debut into comics, Jeong-in Mun tells the story of her family's past through the eyes of three generations of women. In the center of the narrative stands her grandmother Chunja. As a single parent, she supported her children working as a Haenyeo diver, harvesting seafood off the coast of Jeju Island, South Korea. With delicate black and white drawings, Jeong-in Mun recounts her grandmother's life with the ocean and her mother's upbringing. "Langer Atem" (Long Breath) shows the effects of the family history on her own life as a young woman split between cultures and continents in a skillful interweaving of different times & perspectives. The result is a touching story about life's hardships, the beauty & perils of the ocean, and the female bonds that echo through generations.

Haenyeo (literally "women of the sea") are female scuba divers who develop impressive abilities to swim underwater without oxygen tanks. In South Korea, the roots of this profession date back centuries. A moving family story that combines south-korean traditions & cultural identity.

"Like a spotlight, one decision leaves an entire life in shadow. The darkness swallows the memories. Even if someone asks about him. Then, like a hammer, the ending shatters any words about travel, friends, family and happiness."

After the sudden suicide of their father, two siblings begin a silent correspondence: she writes to him, he sends drawings back. Each filled page makes visible what words often lack. The dialogue opens a world full of enchanted memories, riddles and feelings that, as intimate as they may be, bring to light something universal: That nothing is as one expects, fears, or hopes. Sister and brother let themselves be accompanied a short way through their present and their past. In the forest of their childhood, on the way through the valley, in multi-layered image-word compositions and allegorical and occasionally ironic drawings they show that in the end a place is often surprisingly more than just a catastrophe.

Langfinger is a teenager, orphan, and self-appointed master thief. He lives in a vacant factory building near a forest with his dog Wackelzahn. Together with Max, whose parents are about to get divorced, and his stone toad Gunter they roam through fallow industrial areas, adjacent fields and forests, throw stones at people, and destroy the territory of the warring gang "Logbuch-Eiche".

In his Coming-of-Age-Story Michel Esselbrügge manages to shape a sociocritical image of adolescent life forms without moralizing. His characters act in a childish world of imagination, consisting of superpowers, banditry and destructive "angry-youth" outcasts. They are looking for affiliation to construct any kind of identity, but they neither become mature nor adult.

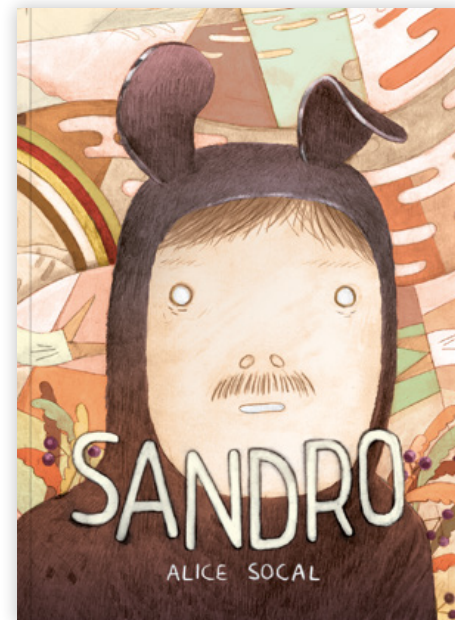
Sandro is a late coming-of-age story, a dreamy yet very real cross-section of the life of 26-year-old Pallas, who cannot free himself from the sweet and stifling embrace of his childhood friend, Sandro. Undeterred, Sandro penetrates all stages and events of growing up with his tenderness and enormous love, confronting the protagonist with a seemingly insurmountable problem: how can he progress in his life without losing the magic and spontaneity that have distinguished his childhood games and dreams? Are new life goals worth it to give up that part of him, which transforms himself into the perfect adventure companion?

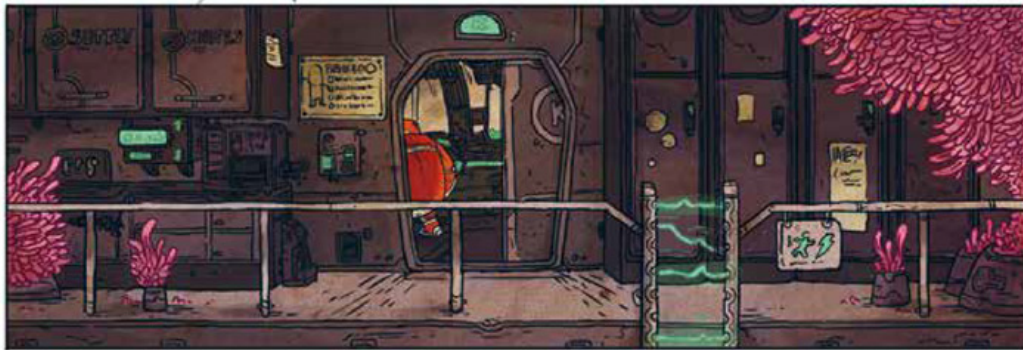
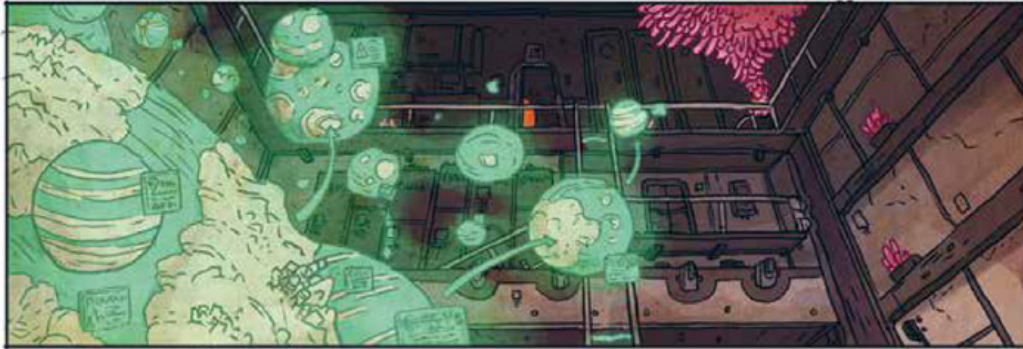
It also tells of the recovered friendship between Pallas and Frank. The two young men have not seen each other since school, when Frank was the coolest guy in the class. But he also had to deal with the difficulties of growing up and his own failure. After a burnout, he is managed today by a life coach, a troublesome three-headed goose. The story is an invitation to be honest with oneself and to accept the own limitations and shortcomings, perhaps ultimately to recognize and love yourself – regardless of what the personal three-headed goose advocates for success in life and career.
